Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Monroe-Gregg School District is excited to announce that beginning this 2020-2021 school year, each student, including those who choose the E-Learning option, will receive a school-issued device. This device will be assigned to the student and will be used each day in class, at home to complete assignments, during extended absences, or in the event the school is closed for any reason (inclement weather, health and wellness, etc.). The rental for the device will be \$70 per year. Building principals have worked to remove some previous fee and rental costs from the yearly book rental in order to keep the overall cost manageable for families.

In order to receive the Chromebook, each student must have on file a completed One2One Risk Solutions damage waiver and payment process. This process will help secure costs in the event that the Chromebook is damaged, lost, or stolen. We will have staff ready to assist families with this sign-up process during our in-person registration night on July 29th from 1 pm - 7 pm.

Chromebooks will be distributed to students attending Monrovia Middle School and Monrovia High School on July 31st and August 3rd from 9 am - 11 am and 2 pm - 6 pm. Students attending Monrovia Elementary School will receive their device from their teacher on August 7th. Devices will only be distributed to students who have a completed One2One Risk Solution damage waiver and payment on file. Attached you will find the Monroe-Gregg School District Acceptable Use Policy and the Monroe-Gregg School District Device Usage Guidelines and Procedures forms.

This is an amazing opportunity, and we are excited to be able to offer school-issued devices to each of our students. This will increase the students' capacity to learn and apply 21st century skills on a daily basis. All of the Monroe-Gregg School District teachers have been working hard this summer to create new and innovative lessons that blend traditional learning with digital learning and are prepared to implement those this school year. We know that this initiative will have a positive impact on our students' success.
