Monroe-Gregg School District eLearning/Snow Day FAQ

What is eLearning?

eLearning utilizes technology to allow students to continue the instructional day outside of the traditional setting. It is led by Monroe-Gregg School District teachers and is guided by current Indiana State Standards, allowing the progression of learning to continue in spite of challenges such as inclement weather. It also provides flexibility for opportunities such as staff professional development while allowing students to cultivate digital skills, cooperate virtually, and employ virtual resources.

How will families be notified of eLearning/ Snow Days?

Families will be notified of eLearning/ Snow Days just as they are notified of school delays and closures: via telephone and email alert; social media, www.m-gsd.org; and local news channels.

How will attendance be recorded on an eLearning/ Snow Day?

If a student cannot participate, then a parent/ guardian should follow regular attendance notification procedures and contact the building office before 7:30 am to report the absence. Students are still responsible for completing eLearning/ Snow Day assignments.

MES students will be expected to log into their Google Classrooms to retrieve their activities.

Those who do not have internet access or experience power outages and can not complete assignments; will be able to turn in or make up their activities once they return to school.

MMS and MHS students are expected to complete the Daily Attendance Check In form (located in their flex period class for MMS students).

What will an eLearning/ Snow Day look like for students?

Although it is preferred that assignments are completed and submitted on the eLearning/ Snow Day, a five-day window will be provided. Day one is considered the day the assignment is provided, and all work must be completed by the start of class on day five. The five days do not include weekends or holidays. Students who do not complete the assignment within five days will be marked absent.

MES students will be expected to log in to their Google Classrooms to retrieve their Snow Day activities. Our goal for our students is to engage in STEM/Science Activities. Snow Days will replace our Science Days from previous years.

MMS and MHS students will be expected to log in to their online learning platforms (Google Classroom, Canvas, etc.) and complete their assignments throughout the day. Assignments and resources will be available by 9 am. Teachers and staff will be available throughout the day for any questions or clarifications.

What will an eLearning/ Snow Day look like for teachers?

Teachers will add eLearning lessons to their online platforms (i.e. learning management systems) by 9:00 am and will be virtually accessible between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm on eLearning Days.

What if a student requires technology-related assistance during an eLearning/ Snow Day?

What if a student doesn't have internet access at home?

Families without internet access may utilize free WiFi in the following areas within the Monroe-Gregg School District: Monrovia High School and Monrovia Elementary School parking lots; Monrovia Performing Arts Center Parking Lot; Monrovia Public Library Parking Lot; outside the Monrovia Community Building; Wilbur Fire Station.
