Covid19 Health Plan  
2021-2022

The goal of the health services department of Monroe Gregg Schools is to keep our students and staff healthy throughout the entire school within the guidelines given to us.

**Masks-** Masks will be required to attend school in person. (Re-evaluation of this policy in 30 days)

- If your student attends Area 31 they will be required to wear a mask while attending classes on that campus. (per Marion county guidelines)
- Masks will be REQUIRED on all school buses to and from school. (per federal mandate) This includes all buses to and from extra-curricular activities such as athletics events, band/ choir competitions, academic competitions and field trips.

**Illness-** Covid 19 is still present and new cases continue to be reported daily. Please keep your student at home if they are experiencing any of the following symptoms

- Fever greater than 100.4 degrees
- Sudden loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Headache (especially when accompanied by a fever)
- Cough or shortness of breath
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and abdominal pain

**Covid- 19 testing- If** your student or any member of your family/household is tested for Covid all students living in the household must stay home until you receive the results.

**Quarantine/ Close Contact-** Contact tracing and quarantine are still required by the CDC and Indiana Department of Health.

Close contact is defined as someone who lives in the same household with, or someone who has been within 6 feet of a positive person for more than 15 minutes in a 24 hour period.

Fully vaccinated is defined as someone who is 14 days out from receiving the second dose of a Covid 19 vaccine.

### Quarantine Guidelines-

- Students/ Staff who tests positive must quarantine at home for 10 days and may return to school on day 11.
- Students/ staff who live in the household of someone who tests positive must quarantine for 14 days from the day tested and may return to school on day 15. If the student or staff is fully vaccinated for Covid 19 they do not need to quarantine.
- Any student who is deemed a close contact through contact tracing will NOT have to quarantine. Parents will be notified and will need to monitor their student for 14 days from the date of exposure or test date of the positive person. The student continues to attend school unless symptoms develop. If symptoms develop the student will then need to quarantine from the exposure date. If the student or staff is fully vaccinated they will not have to quarantine.
- Student can still be quarantined from a close contact at lunch, extracurricular activities and from exposure from outside of school.
